The college is running various undergraduate and postgraduate courses in Arts, Commerce, and Science streams. The college offers twenty one subject combinations for study in Arts. CBCS is adopted in commerce and science streams. Some courses offer experiential learning through project / field work. Environmental Studies and Computer Awareness are integral part of undergraduate degree courses in all streams. The students are provided opportunities to learn about various life- essential skills and competence required for team work through NCC, NSS and Youth Red Cross. The college is in a position to adopt multidisciplinary/ Interdisciplinary approach in accordance with the mandate of NEP- 2020. Faculty members are also encouraged to carry multidisciplinary/ Interdisciplinary research.

17. Skill development:

The college has adopted following practices pertaining to the skill development: The institution seeks to inculcate innovative ideas through project-based learning. Students, especially in the domain of sciences, work on different projects. Students from the Department of Computer Science, Botany, Zoology & Geography make projects/report on novel/emerging scientific ideas and regularly participate in Science Exhibitions. Students undertaking these projects develop an understanding for possible research areas for their further studies. A well-equipped language lab has been established to hone the communication skills of the students so that they have a competitive edge in the professional world. ICT training programme was conducted for non-teaching staff members of the college.

The college offers Hindi and Sanskrit as independent subjects in B.A. programme. Various activities like meditation, yoga and self-defense activities are organised to promote Indian knowledge system. 1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well planned and documented process

Our college is affiliated with Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar, so we follow the curriculum designed by the varsity only. At the beginning of the academic session, the college prepares the academic calendar which consists of curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities for effective implementation and delivery of the curriculum. We undertake the following measures for effective delivery of the university curriculum at the college level

- There is a faculty-wise timetable committee that prepares the timetable as per workload for the academic session.
- A comprehensive teaching plan is prepared by every department and teacher which includes the delivery of lectures, tutorials, and practicals.
- The Principal addresses the newly admitted students in the "Induction/orientation Program". This program orients the students about facilities and welfare schemes available, code of conduct and discipline, add-on courses, and extra-curricular activities.
- The faculty members take a few lectures on the introduction of the curriculum.
- Unit Tests are conducted periodically and their results are displayed and discussed with the students in the classroom.
- Periodical meetings of Head of the Departments are held with the Principal to take review and discuss the curriculum delivery.
- Intra-departmental meetings for the review of the teaching, planning of unit tests, seminars, etc. are also conducted.
- Assignments, seminars, and projects are given to the students under the supervision of the faculty.
- Guest lectures of eminent faculty members from other institutions are arranged to give exposure to the current trends and the latest subject knowledge.
- ICT is used for effective teaching by the teachers of various departments.
- The departments organize study tours and field projects for students' exposure to practical knowledge.
- The faculty members encourage the students to read the reference books and make use of magazines and newspapers available at the college library to update and enhance their subject knowledge.

- Remedial coaching is given to slow learners and the merit mission concept is implemented for advanced learners. Additional facilities such as extra book issues and personal counseling are provided to slow and advanced learners.

Internal Assessment tests (IA), assignments, quizzes, and seminars are part of the Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) of students.

There is a well-defined process for the conduct of CIE as per the institute's calendar of events which includes details like the total number of working days and holidays, house examination dates, dates for the Institute's flagship programs, workshops, and other co-curricular and extra-curricular activities. All activities are conducted in adherence to the calendar of events except unforeseen circumstances. Department heads closely supervise and monitor the completion of the syllabus as per the academic calendar prepared by the varsity.

- The internal assessment test timetable prepared by the examination committee is published to stakeholders and conducted as per the schedule.
- Evaluation of answer sheets and students' attendance in the lecture are carried out by respective Course Instructors.
- Continuous evaluation and assessments are also done for laboratory courses, project work, seminars, and internships.
- Conduction of laboratory experiments and viva, Submission of records are the major components of laboratory course evaluation. As per the laboratory rubrics, the internal test is conducted at the end of the semester.

The Principal, through the academic committee meetings, frequently reviews the semester's progress and provides suitable suggestions. In case of revision of the academic calendar by the university, the institute incorporates the necessary changes accordingly.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

The institution runs the courses in Arts, Commerce, and Science stream. The curriculum is designed by the Guru Jambheshwar

University of Science & Technology, Hisar which includes various topics/chapters covering cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment & Sustainability, Human Values, and Professional Ethics.

Environmental study is a compulsory subject for all undergraduate first-year students. Similarly, Cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Human Values, and Professional Ethics are covered in the prescribed syllabi of varsity in various subjects in the form of topics, chapters, poems, and co-curricular activities, especially in the domain of literature, humanity, and social sciences.

Environment and Sustainability

As far as Environment and Sustainability related issues are concerned, the students got the knowledge of environmental studies in the first year of their degree program. The institution took care to inculcate values related to the environment and sustainability through various practices and programs under NSS and NCC. Besides this, the departments conduct the following activities in every academic session: -

- Botany and Zoology departments keep organizing the poster-making competitions, Bio Rangoli, Plantation Photography.
- The geography department regularly organizes various competitions such as Poster making, Geo Rangoli, Collage making, Slogan writing on environmental issues, Quiz, etc. Besides this, Students' visits to the meteorological station, Kisan Mela, HARSAC, etc. are also organized by the department as and when possible.
- NSS and NCC Units conduct Tree Plantation, Beti Bachao, Beti Padao, Rashtriya Ekta Diwas Celebration, Swatch Bharat Abhiyan, Voters' Day and keep raising their concerns on multiple social menace exits in the Indian society.
- A distillation unit has also been established in the department of botany.
- Gender Equity The prose, poetry and other chapters in certain courses addressed issues related to gender sensitivity and equity. Additionally, the women cell of our institute organizes special programs on gender equality and sensitization such as self-defense training for girls, motivational lectures by elite personalities.

As per the directions of the Haryana government, Complaint Cell has been constituted for the Redressal of complaints about sexual harassment. The Internal Complaint Cell is involved in the

prevention, prohibition, and redressal of the complaints regarding sexual harassment of women employees and students and conducted an awareness campaign. The following programs are organized.

- Blood Donation Camp is regularly organized.
- NCC's coursework also includes Disaster management so that the students get familiar with their social responsibility.
- NSS unit is very active and regularly arranged social and cultural activities in the college and adopted villages. Professional Ethics Ethical practices such as truthful information, facts, and unprejudiced approach are taught in the content of syllabus and certificate courses.
- Career Guidance and Placement Cell keeps organizing extension lectures covering topics in accordance with the requirements of the industry.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Identification of Advanced and Slow learners

To identify advanced and slow learners, we conduct a "student

induction/Orientation" program i.e. Principal's Address. Through this event, students are introduced to teaching-learning and evaluation programs, college discipline, various academic and other schemes along with development and achievements of the college, students' support services. As early as possible, we identify slow and advanced learners amongst the students through classroom discussion, question and answer method, by considering their subject knowledge and previous year's performance, From the second year onwards; we consider their performance in the classroom and the university examinations. The academic performance of the students helps in identifying the slow and advanced learners.

Scheme for slow learners

- To enhance their performance the college conducted remedial coaching. Extra coaching is provided in respective subjects.
- Problem-solving sessions and additional tutorials are conducted for weak students.
- The students are also given extra books from the departmental library.
- To improve the confidence level of the students, confidence-building lectures are arranged. Some faculty members guide the students personally as well as they are also encouraged to discuss their problems.
- Extra time is allotted to slow learners to complete tasks such as reading, problem-solving, and analysis of the experiment.
- Extra reading material is provided to improve basic understanding of the subject and efforts are also being made to upload video lectures on YouTube for students to review to understand difficult concepts.
- Encouraging them to study courses on developing soft skills to have good command over the language.

Schemes for advanced learners

- Students are encouraged to make research contributions in their major project at the PG level and are also encouraged to publish their results in journals and also present it at National and International Conferences.
- Students are encouraged to participate in summer research fellowship programs at prestigious research institutes and laboratories.
- Earn while you learn provision has been made for UG, PG students in the Institute.
- Students are encouraged to help slow learners in their classes and in junior classes.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Teaching-learning methods adopted by the faculty members include Lecture Method, Interactive Method, Project-based Learning, Computer-assisted Learning, Experiential Learning, etc. The Teaching-learning activities are made effective through illustration and special lectures. To acquire first-hand knowledge on the subjects and current practices students are engaged in a field study. Lessons are taught through Powerpoint presentations to make learning interesting besides oral presenting methods.

Lecture method

This conventional method is commonly adopted by all teachers, especially language teachers. This method facilitates the teacher to interpret, explain and revise the content of a text-only for better understanding of the subject by the learners.

Interactive method

The faculty members make learning interactive with students by motivating student participation in group discussion, role-play, quiz contests, news analysis, educational games, etc.

ICT Enabled Teaching

- ICT-enabled teaching includes Wi-Fi-enabled classrooms with

LCD, Language Lab, Smart Classrooms, etc.

- Virtual classroom links are also being provided to the students to maintain continuity in lectures during the lockdown.
- The institution adopts modern pedagogy in line with emerging trends to enhance the teaching-learning process.
- The institution has the essential equipment to support the faculty members and students.
- Regular practical sessions, Online grammar tests, Use of LCD projectors for seminars and workshops, Productive use of educational videos,
- Accounting software, online trading is offered by the Department of Commerce.
- Communication skills training is provided to students during Language lab sessions. Software is effectively used to train students to acquire proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- The institution has installed Wi-Fi on the campus to support the educational activities of the inmates.

Group Learning Method

Group Learning allows slow learners to develop problem-solving, interpersonal, presentational, and communication skills to confirm quality in learning with Peer groups. Under group learning, heterogeneous groups of students comprising Fast, Average, and Slow learners are divided into groups of 5 to 10 members. Group Projects or Assignments are conducted by the B.Com, students under the group learning method.

The experiential/Laboratory method is used in science subjects to acquaint the students with the facts through direct experience individually. Students verify the facts and laws of the subject with the help of experiments.

- Video Conferencing- Students have been counseled with the help of Zoom / Google meet applications.
- Video lecture- Recording of video lectures is made available to students for long-term learning and future referencing.

There is a standard process of internal assessment in the college. According to the academic calendar, a student has to appear in a 1-unit test and submit 2 assignments. The schedule of the internal examination is decided by the examination committee. Faculty members are obliged to take the unit tests according to the date sheet prepared by the examination committee. The test copy of the unit test is shown to students for their observation and the students' performance is discussed in the classrooms. Records of unit tests and assignments are maintained by the faculty members.

At the college level, an examination committee is constituted by the principal for the smooth conduction of internal examination (unit test). The end-semester examination is conducted by the university, and the students appear at the examination centers allotted by the university. The college strictly follows the guidelines and rules issued by the affiliating university while conducting internals and end-semester examinations. For conducting the internal assessment test, a department level coordinator/committee is constituted

- One internal unit test is conducted each semester.
- Time table for the internal examination is prepared well in advance and communicated to the students.
- After evaluation of answer books, the same are shown to the students to check any discrepancy or doubt in checking. If they come across any doubts, clarification is given by the faculty members.
- By adopting the criteria as per the direction of affiliating university, complete transparency is maintained in internal assessment tests.
- Just after the preparation of the tentative internal assessment, one of the copies of the same is shared among students. Students are also given ample time to submit their objections regarding assessment.
- The final internal assessment marks (calculated on the basis of attendance, class test, and assignments) are uploaded on the university portal at the end of each semester.

Attainment of the Course Outcomes

The course outcomes are measured through the syllabus, completion of syllabus, continuous evaluation (internal evaluation).

At the Departmental level, the Heads of the Department and the teachers who are engaged in any class strive to complete the courses in time and in some cases, extra classes are conducted for the students who they identify as relatively average. The 75 per cent of compulsory attendance to qualify for writing the examination of the courses is adhered to, to ensure students participate in the class. The attendance is also tied with marks. Faculty members are also obliged to maintain the complete data of the students so that the teacher can keep apprising the student about their progress. The continuous evaluation is done through tests, written assignments, project work, oral presentations, fieldwork and so on. The end semester examination of every course is based on a written examination of three hours, the question paper of which is required to test the knowledge of the student from every unit prescribed for

study.

The programme specific outcomes are measured by taking the aggregate result of all courses in a given programme of an individual student, and then the average performance of all the students in a given programme.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has adequate physical and academic facilities required as per University Grant Commission guidelines to run the different programs. The college campus area is 22 acres, 1 Kanal and 7 Marla, on which buildings have been constructed is 16187.4 sq. meter area. The various departments in Arts, Commerce, Science, Mathematics, Physical Education streams are located in separate blocks. The Classrooms, Laboratories, and Seminar Halls are ICT-enabled. Besides the building, the college has a spacious playground for sports activities. The college has cultivated an atmosphere that aims to provide ample opportunity for Extra-Curricular and support services organized by departments of the National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC). The college campus is neat and clean. A spacious garden with pavements and pavers on the campus is developed for students' service. Botanical Garden has also been developed to provide practical exposure for teaching and learning. Our institution also has an English language lab carrying 20 computers wherein ORELL software has also been installed to improve the students' English language.

- **Classrooms:** The college encompasses 70 well-furnished, well-ventilated, spacious classrooms out of which 9 classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors for conducting theory classes.
- **Technology-Enabled learning facility:** The College has four ICT-enabled Classrooms where the provision of Multimedia learning, smart boards, Wi-Fi connectivity, and internet access is available.
- **Seminar Hall:** The College has multiple seminar halls. These halls are regularly used for conducting national/international seminars at the college. The students are promoted for active involvement in paper presentations, group discussions, etc.
- **Laboratories:** All laboratories are well equipped with state-of-the-art equipment and facilities. All the laboratories are established as per UGC norms. These labs are utilized for conducting practical classes as per the requirements of the curriculum. Labs are also utilized for technology learning & training as a part of teaching contents beyond the syllabus. Labs have sufficient licensed software and open source tools to cater to the requirements of curriculum & industry-enabled teaching.
- **Wi-Fi:** The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled with 24/7 internet facilities (available bandwidth 200 MBPS) for the students and staff. Internet facility is available in the whole campus

including labs, classrooms, library, offices of all Departments and hostels.

- **Central Library:** The library has 35125 books available covering all major fields of Commerce, Science, and Humanity. The library also has separate study spaces available for boys and girls. Multiple Resources such as newsletters, journals, reference books are available for students' self-learning at Central library.

The Institute, with its compulsory Core Courses and the continuous evaluation scheme, integrates sports and extra-curricular activities as essential components. This is done not only for participation but also for the assessment of students. The college has adequate facilities for sports, games and cultural activities. CRM Jat College has two large playgrounds and one auditorium with provisions for multiple games, such as Athletics, Cricket, Football, Hockey, Kabaddi, Volleyball, Basketball, and Kho-kho, etc. Indoor and outdoor badminton courts and gymnasium are also available. The college has well-equipped assembly halls for organizing annual functions and cultural events wherein various cultural events are being organized. Facilities for outdoor and indoor sports and games that include badminton, carrom, table tennis, chess, gymnasium, and cultural activities also exist in the Girls' Hostel. Intra-college and inter-college games and sports competitions are organized regularly every year for students. Students are especially being trained for participation in Zonal and Inter-Zonal National Youth Festivals, Poster making competitions, science exhibitions, etc. organized by the Indian varsities/colleges, Non-Profit Organisations. CRM Jat College has excelled at these events by winning prizes and awards in individual and group events. The athletic meet is also being organized in the Institute every year. The college participates in different events like Plays, Mimes, Folk Dance, One-Act Plays, Street Plays, etc. in the university inter-collegiate, State, and National levels. The annual function is also celebrated in the college each year to mark the birth anniversary of Seth Shri Chhaju Ram Ji. For this participation, students of the

college are provided with experts' guidance in the college premises. A separate cultural committee is formed in the college which maintains the record of the same. Details of the Prizes won by students, Activities organized by the college, and Students' participation in various activities are enclosed herewith.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The college has developed IT facilities to meet the learning requirements of students and faculty. Some of the facilities are discussed below: -

Computer Lab: - The computer lab consists of 145 computers with Internet connectivity for the purpose of the students who opted for computer, mathematics, commerce, physics as part of their courses as well as for general purposes. All the required software as per the curriculum are installed and updated as and when required and the maintenance of the computers is done by the technicians as and when required.

English Language Lab:- One English Language Lab has been developed with 20 computers and the software required to train the students on revised grammar bits, phonetic pronunciation, phonetic transcription, and other English language skills. The college has also purchased ORELL software for this purpose.

Nine classrooms enabled with ICT facilities like a projector, a

personal computer attached with a projector. One video recording room is also used for the online learning environment. Physics lab, Botany Lab, Zoology Lab, and Computer Labs have projectors. The college has a well-equipped seminar hall enabled with ICT facilities like a projector, a personal computer attached with projector. In addition to projector and computer, seminar hall is equipped with mike, speakers and internet connection. The whole campus of the college has Wi-Fi facility with a speed of 10 Mbps. The computers and printers of the office and exam branch and Computer Labs are connected through LAN. The college website is monitored and updated from time to time by the Web Coordinator of the college. The computers of the college are connected with printers and scanners wherever required. The college has 2 multipurpose photocopy machines placed in the administrative block. There are 46 CCTV cameras installed in the entire campus area of the college to provide additional safety security to the students and the staff, for the prevention of untoward incidents on the campus. All the departments have computers, having Internet facility via Wi-Fi, and a leased line for smooth conduct of online classes. For maintenance (such as repairs/servicing of computers, Internet Wi-Fi networking, installation of software, and maintenance and up-gradation of hardware), all departments will approach the higher authorities and, repairs/servicing and up-gradation of computers are done accordingly. Software like Java, C, C++, SQL, and Tally is installed in computer labs Institute has upgraded the 100 Mbps Internet connectivity to 200 Mbps. The Internet Service Provider (ISP) Reliance provides Jio Wi-Fi connectivity with 10Mbps Internet Connectivity and Triple play service has also been availed for the offices.

Maintenance of Library Facilities: The books and journals are maintained against disfiguring. Bookbinding is carried out on regular basis for damaged books to avoid further damage. Stock verification is done as a part of regular monitoring and control. Pest control is done on regular basis for keeping books safe from termites. Library Committee has been constituted for looking after the following matters.

- Procurement of new books & renew of journals and recommendations for additional books.
- Updating and maintaining all library records.

- Addressing issues and grievances of users.
- Update and upgrade the library contents, periodically as per updates in curriculum

Computers: The institute has an adequate number of computers with internet connections and utility software. Computer systems, UPS, Software, and Servers are maintained by outsourced technicians, Lab Assistants, and Lab-In Charges. IT infrastructure is maintained by the head, IT Coordinator with the departmental coordinator.

Classrooms, Conference Hall: Classrooms and Seminar halls are provided with enough seating capacity and LCD projectors. Cleanliness of classrooms and seminar hall is maintained on regular basis. Working condition of the audio system, LCD projectors, etc. is done on regular basis.

Laboratory: Laboratories are regularly maintained by the Laboratory attendant. Records of types of equipment are maintained in the stock Register as per the process. Equipment are maintained properly, calibrated, and serviced periodically. Major breakdown maintenance if required is carried out by external agencies.

Maintenance of other support systems

- Housekeeping for regular cleanliness of corridors, washrooms, classrooms, laboratories, and premises is done by external agencies.
- Sanitizing of washrooms is done on regular basis.
- Greenery is maintained by the gardeners appointed by the college.
- Solar Panels and power backup facilities like Generators are maintained by the Internal Electrical maintenance department.
- Clean and hygienic drinking water is available in the Institute.
- Water coolers are maintained and cleaned on regular basis.
- Overhead water tanks and water coolers are cleaned periodically.
- The quality of drinking water is checked by measuring pH and Hardness.
- Sports facilities are maintained by the sports committee and the menial staff.

The below-mentioned points are inspected before the start of every semester.

- Classroom facilities such as lights and fans, LCD projector and sound system, availability of internet connections are inspected before the start of every semester.
- Working condition of computers, devices, and equipment is ensured.
- The working condition of machines in the laboratories is ensured.
- The cleanliness committee of the institute inspects the facilities like toilets, classrooms, corridors.
- The College administration supervises the cleanliness and hygiene in the canteen and monitors the food quality.
- The Library committee collects the specific needs of the students and staff.
- The sports committee ensures the availability of sports equipment and monitors the usage of the ground, courts, and indoor games facilities.

Examination and Evaluation

The academic calendar for conduct of examination and evaluation is prepared by GJUS&T. The college ensures that all examination related rules and regulations of the university are strictly followed. There is one midterm examination to be conducted in a semester by the institution and at the end of semester, end term examination and evaluation is conducted by the University. Under CBCS there is a mechanism of 80:20, in which evaluation for 80 marks is done through major examinations on semester basis and 20 marks are awarded on the basis of continuous evaluation through unit test, assignments, class attendance, class participation, etc.

Teaching and Learning

Teaching and learning has been organized through the academic calendar of the University. Student - centric learning is promoted through extensive use of ICT like smart class rooms, LCD projectors, etc. Seminars, conferences and extension lectures are organised to update the students' knowledge. List of Program/Course learning goals and outcomes are prepared by HOD which helps teachers to focus on the intended purpose of the curriculum and allow planning instructions to achieve the desired results in terms of knowledge, skills, and attitudes. Learning is promoted through various student-oriented activities like quiz competitions, declamation contests, and poster making competitions etc. Remedial classes, internal tests are conducted on a routine basis.

Utilization of Funds

- The quotations are scrutinized by the purchase committee before a final decision is made based on parameters like pricing, quality, terms of service, etc.

- The Principal and purchase committee along with the accounts department ensure that the expenditure lies within the allotted budget. The intervention of the management is sought in case the expenditure exceeds the budget.

Resource Mobilization Policy and Procedure

- Just after the collection of students' fee, it is further segregated among various heads such as Amalgamation, R.K. Fund etc.. Availability of funds under each head is taken as the maximum amount to be spent (budget) for the respective purpose.
- The institutional budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity and internet charges, stationery & other maintenance costs.
- It includes planned expenses such as lab equipment purchases, furniture, and other development expenses.
- The budget is scrutinized by the Accounts department and Purchase department monitor whether expenses are exceeding budget provision.
- Statutory auditors are also appointed who certify the financial statements in every financial year. The grants received by the college are also audited by certified auditors.

Optimal utilization of resources

- The college aims at promoting research, development, consultancy and such other activities, involving the faculty at various levels.

INSTITUTIONAL VALUES AND BEST PRACTICES

7.1 - Institutional Values and Social Responsibilities

7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year

To achieve the aim of women empowerment and promote gender equity, the college has adopted following measures:

1. **Women Cell:** A Women Cell, comprised of three female teachers, organizes counseling sessions, interactive talks and other such events to sensitize girl students towards their rights and roles in the society. It celebrates important days and events to strengthen the discourse of gender equality.
2. **Internal Complaint Committee/Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee:** The said committee is comprised of faculty members, representatives from NGO and legal consultant. It addresses the grievances of girl students and female employees and ensures gender based justice.
3. **Common Room Facility:** Separate Common Room Facility is available for girls.
4. **Girls Hostel:** The institution has a separate girls hostel with a capacity of 31 rooms.
5. **Safety and Security:** The institution has its own security service in the form of guards hired through an agency. Moreover, the Govt. of Haryana has initiated special security measures for girl students in the Higher Education Institutions by deputing "Durga Shakti" (female police personnels) in the colleges.

During the session 2020-21, the institution organized following activities to foster gender sensitivity:

1. An 'Online Intra-College Poetry Recitation Competition' was organized on September 05, 2020 by the Women Cell. Total 16 videos were received for the competition.
2. An Inter-college Thali Decoration Competition was organized by the Women Cell to celebrate 'Navratri Festival' in October 2020. Total 37 entries were received from different colleges for the competition.
3. A medical team associated with 'Anaemia Free Hisar Campaign' started under the supervision of District Administration, Hisar visited the college on Jan 16, 2021 for examining the HB-level of female students and staff members. Diet Charts and medicines were suggested to the students and staff members having low HB-level.
4. One Day Workshop on the topic 'Give Yourself a Makeover' was organized by the Women Cell on Feb 18, 2021.
5. Department of Geography organized a Public Exhibition on the theme 'From Veil to Wings: Status of Women in Haryana' on the occasion of International Women's Day on March 08, 2021.
6. Department of English organized an Extension Lecture on the topic 'Literature and Gender' on March 05, 2021. Prof. Sunita Siroha from Department of English, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra delivered this lecture.

The college has made efforts to manage the different kinds of waste at the institutional/source level. For solid waste management, Blue - Green dustbins sets worth capacity 480 ltrs have been installed at three main spots in the college for the purpose of waste segregation. The college has launched its Composting Section with two large compost pits sheltered with Compost Hut. Degradable waste is disposed to these pits in order to convert it in manure which is subsequently used in the college gardens/lawns. The launch of Composting Section was acknowledged by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Govt of India on its twitter handle, Swacch Sarvekshan 2021. Liquid Waste from the water coolers is collected in a large underground tank and used subsequently for watering the Circle Kabbadi Ground. As for E-waste, the college makes optimal use of dysfunctional computer equipments through repair, reuse or reassembling. The hardware which cannot be reused or recycled is disposed off. The institution however intends to sign MoU with relevant agencies for the management of E-waste in the coming years.

The Context:

The aim of education is to train students in such a manner that they take the learning beyond the walls of classroom and make selfless contribution to society. The institution is guided by a similar spirit advanced by the founder of the institution, Seth Chhaju Ram Chaudhary who brought immense change in society through his philanthropic deeds. The institution considers it one of its utmost responsibilities to promote the vision and ideology of its guiding force. Precisely to serve this objective, due attention is given to social outreach programmes and initiatives which are undertaken by the volunteers/cadets under the guidance of Programme Officer/Counsellor/NCC Officer.

The Practice:

3 NSS Units, NCC Army Wing (Boys), NCC Army Wing (Girls), NCC Air Wing, Youth Red Cross and Women Cell of the college are actively engaged in sensitizing students towards their social responsibilities. College NSS Units undertake various programmes in the adopted village Gangwa, urban slums and college campus. These programmes include HIV AIDS Awareness programmes, Polio Immunization, Health Awareness programmes, Road Safety Rallies, Environment Awareness Rallies and Covid-19 Relief Campaigns. Youth Red Cross Unit organises Blood Donation Camps in collaboration with various Govt and Non-Govt organizations. The volunteers also provided timely oxygen help to home quarantine patients during the pandemic. NCC Units have adopted Statues/Memorials of martyrs and Freedom Fighters and ensured their maintenance and cleanliness. They organise Swacchta Pakhwadas, Plantation Drives and other activities of social and environmental relevance. Women Cell of the College organizes interactive sessions and competitions to sensitize students for the cause of gender equality. It conducted medical check-up camp as part of Anaemia Free Hisar Campaign of District Administration.

Best Practice-II

Title of the Practice: Financial Aid to the Deserving Students:

Many students seek admission from the rural areas with low economic back ground. Their parents are unable to provide them a sustained financial support because agriculture, being a source of uncertain income, is the main source of livelihood to a majority of the people in Haryana.

Objectives of the Practice:

- To extend financial aid to the poor students, especially from the rural background, to save them from discontinuation of their studies owing to poverty.
- To support financially all the deserving poor students without any discrimination of caste, creed or gender.
- To promote the 'equality' among the students.
- Scholarships and Fee concession to Sports achievers, SC/ST students, students achieving academic excellence.

The Context:

Sending children to the city for higher education becomes almost impossible for the poor parents in the rural areas, in the context of higher education demanding higher amounts of money. Though, sometimes, they do venture to admit their children to colleges in the city, they are unable to give sustained financial support throughout the course of study because agriculture, being a source

of uncertain income, is the main source of livelihood to a majority of the people in Haryana. So, it is evident that without financial support from an external source, the rural youth cannot hope to successfully complete their higher studies.

The Practice:

Fee Concession Committee is constituted. Committee asks aspirants to send parents tax return transcripts, sibling's college registration forms, proof of income or other supporting documentation etc. This illustrious institution, true to its legacy of pro poor student attitude since its inception, has taken a firm resolve to extend all possible financial support to the deserving students and help them to realize their fond dream of acquiring higher education. The financial support is extended to all the deserving poor students without any discrimination of caste, creed or gender. The students whose parents do not have fixed reasonable source of income are eligible for the aid. A duly constituted committee of senior teachers scrutinizes the applications received from the aspirants for fee concession. It finalizes the list of eligible students for the Fee concession after due verification of the documentary evidence enclosed and strictly following the guidelines framed for the purpose, and submits the same to the Principal for sanctioning the actual amount of the aid.

Evidence of Success:

A good numbers of rural students have successfully completed their higher studies without facing financial hurdles due to the financial aid/concession given by the institution.

- The noble objective had challenges in its designing and implementation.
- Pooling up of the required resources is a tough task.
- Verification of the financial background of the aspirants is yet another challenge.

Our college is affiliated with Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar, so we follow the curriculum designed by the varsity only. At the beginning of the academic session, the college prepares the academic calendar which consists of curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities for effective implementation and delivery of the curriculum. We undertake the following measures for effective delivery of the university curriculum at the college level

- There is a faculty-wise timetable committee that prepares the timetable as per workload for the academic session.
- A comprehensive teaching plan is prepared by every department and teacher which includes the delivery of lectures, tutorials, and practicals.
- The Principal addresses the newly admitted students in the "Induction/orientation Program". This program orients the students about facilities and welfare schemes available, code of conduct and discipline, add-on courses, and extra-curricular activities.
- The faculty members take a few lectures on the introduction of the curriculum.
- Unit Tests are conducted periodically and their results are displayed and discussed with the students in the classroom.
- Periodical meetings of Head of the Departments are held with the Principal to take review and discuss the curriculum delivery.
- Intra-departmental meetings for the review of the teaching, planning of unit tests, seminars, etc. are also conducted.
- Assignments, seminars, and projects are given to the students under the supervision of the faculty.
- Guest lectures of eminent faculty members from other institutions are arranged to give exposure to the current trends and the latest subject knowledge.
- ICT is used for effective teaching by the teachers of various departments.
- The departments organize study tours and field projects for students' exposure to practical knowledge.
- The faculty members encourage the students to read the

reference books and make use of magazines and newspapers available at the college library to update and enhance their subject knowledge.

- Remedial coaching is given to slow learners and the merit mission concept is implemented for advanced learners. Additional facilities such as extra book issues and personal counseling are provided to slow and advanced learners.

- Continuous evaluation and assessments are also done for laboratory courses, project work, seminars, and

internships.

- Conduction of laboratory experiments and viva, Submission of records are the major components of laboratory course evaluation. As per the laboratory rubrics, the internal test is conducted at the end of the semester.

The Principal, through the academic committee meetings, frequently reviews the semester's progress and provides suitable suggestions. In case of revision of the academic calendar by the university, the institute incorporates the necessary changes accordingly.

The institution runs the courses in Arts, Commerce, and Science stream. The curriculum is designed by the Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar which includes various topics/chapters covering cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment & Sustainability, Human Values, and Professional Ethics.

Environmental study is a compulsory subject for all undergraduate first-year students. Similarly, Cross-cutting issues relevant to Gender, Human Values, and Professional Ethics are covered in the prescribed syllabi of varsity in various subjects in the form of topics, chapters, poems, and co-curricular activities, especially in the domain of literature, humanity, and social sciences.

Environment and Sustainability

As far as Environment and Sustainability related issues are concerned, the students got the knowledge of environmental studies in the first year of their degree program. The institution took care to inculcate values related to the environment and sustainability through various practices and programs under NSS and NCC. Besides this, the departments conduct the following activities in every academic session: -

- Botany and Zoology departments keep organizing the poster-making competitions, Bio Rangoli, Plantation Photography.
- The geography department regularly organizes various competitions such as Poster making, Geo Rangoli, Collage making, Slogan writing on environmental issues, Quiz, etc. Besides this, Students' visits to the meteorological station, Kisan Mela, HARSAC, etc. are also organized by the department as and when possible.

The academic performance of the students helps in identifying the slow and advanced learners.

Scheme for slow learners

- To enhance their performance the college conducted remedial coaching. Extra coaching is provided in respective subjects.
- Problem-solving sessions and additional tutorials are conducted for weak students.
- The students are also given extra books from the departmental library.
- To improve the confidence level of the students, confidence-building lectures are arranged. Some faculty members guide the students personally as well as they are also encouraged to discuss their problems.
- Extra time is allotted to slow learners to complete tasks such as reading, problem-solving, and analysis of the experiment.
- Extra reading material is provided to improve basic understanding of the subject and efforts are also being made to upload video lectures on YouTube for students to

review to understand difficult concepts.

- Encouraging them to study courses on developing soft skills to have good command over the language.

Schemes for advanced learners

- Students are encouraged to make research contributions in their major project at the PG level and are also encouraged to publish their results in journals and also present it at National and International Conferences.
- Students are encouraged to participate in summer research fellowship programs at prestigious research institutes and laboratories.
- Earn while you learn provision has been made for UG, PG students in the Institute.
- Students are encouraged to help slow learners in their classes and in junior classes.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Teaching-learning methods adopted by the faculty members include Lecture Method, Interactive Method, Project-based Learning, Computer-assisted Learning, Experiential Learning, etc. The Teaching-learning activities are made effective through illustration and special lectures. To acquire first-hand knowledge on the subjects and current practices students are engaged in a field study. Lessons are taught through Powerpoint

presentations to make learning interesting besides oral presenting methods.

Lecture method

This conventional method is commonly adopted by all teachers, especially language teachers. This method facilitates the teacher to interpret, explain and revise the content of a text-only for better understanding of the subject by the learners.

Interactive method

The faculty members make learning interactive with students by motivating student participation in group discussion, role-play, quiz contests, news analysis, educational games, etc.

ICT Enabled Teaching

- ICT-enabled teaching includes Wi-Fi-enabled classrooms with LCD, Language Lab, Smart Classrooms, etc.
- Virtual classroom links are also being provided to the students to maintain continuity in lectures during the lockdown.
- The institution adopts modern pedagogy in line with emerging trends to enhance the teaching-learning process.
- The institution has the essential equipment to support the faculty members and students.
- Regular practical sessions, Online grammar tests, Use of LCD projectors for seminars and workshops, Productive use of educational videos,
- Accounting software, online trading is offered by the Department of Commerce.
- Communication skills training is provided to students during Language lab sessions. Software is effectively used to train students to acquire proficiency in listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- The institution has installed Wi-Fi on the campus to support the educational activities of the inmates.

Group Learning Method

Group Learning allows slow learners to develop problem-solving, interpersonal, presentational, and communication skills to confirm quality in learning with Peer groups. Under group learning, heterogeneous groups of students comprising Fast, Average, and Slow learners are divided into groups of 5 to 10

members. Group Projects or Assignments are conducted by the B.Com, students under the group learning method.

The experiential/Laboratory method is used in science subjects to acquaint the students with the facts through direct experience individually. Students verify the facts and laws of the subject with the help of experiments.

At the college level, an examination committee is constituted by the principal for the smooth conduction of internal examination (unit test). The end-semester examination is conducted by the university, and the students appear at the examination centers

allotted by the university. The college strictly follows the guidelines and rules issued by the affiliating university while conducting internals and end-semester examinations. For conducting the internal assessment test, a department level coordinator/committee is constituted

- One internal unit test is conducted each semester.
- Time table for the internal examination is prepared well in advance and communicated to the students.

- By adopting the criteria as per the direction of affiliating university, complete transparency is maintained in internal assessment tests.
- Just after the preparation of the tentative internal assessment, one of the copies of the same is shared among students. Students are also given ample time to submit their objections regarding assessment.
- The final internal assessment marks (calculated on the basis of attendance, class test, and assignments) are uploaded on the university portal at the end of each semester.

The institute has a system in place for measuring the levels of attainment of course outcomes, programme specific outcomes and programme outcomes.

Attainment of the Course Outcomes

The course outcomes are measured through the syllabus, completion of syllabus, continuous evaluation (internal evaluation).

At the Departmental level, the Heads of the Department and the teachers who are engaged in any class strive to complete the courses in time and in some cases, extra classes are conducted for the students who they identify as relatively average. The 75 per cent of compulsory attendance to qualify for writing the examination of the courses is adhered to, to ensure students participate in the class. The attendance is also tied with marks. Faculty members are also obliged to maintain the complete data of the students so that the teacher can keep apprising the student about their progress. The continuous evaluation is done through tests, written assignments, project work, oral presentations, fieldwork and so on. The end semester examination of every course is based on a written examination of three hours, the question paper of which is required to test the knowledge of the student from every unit prescribed for study.

Attainment of the Programme Specific Outcomes

The programme specific outcomes are measured by taking the aggregate result of all courses in a given programme of an individual student, and then the average performance of all the students in a given programme.

Attainment of the Programme Outcomes

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES**4.1 - Physical Facilities**

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The college has adequate physical and academic facilities required as per University Grant Commission guidelines to run the different programs. The college campus area is 22 acres, 1 Kanal and 7 Marla, on which buildings have been constructed is 16187.4 sq. meter area. The various departments in Arts, Commerce, Science, Mathematics, Physical Education streams are

located in separate blocks. The Classrooms, Laboratories, and Seminar Halls are ICT-enabled. Besides the building, the college has a spacious playground for sports activities. The college has cultivated an atmosphere that aims to provide ample opportunity for Extra-Curricular and support services organized by departments of the National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC). The college campus is neat and clean. A spacious garden with pavements and pavers on the campus is developed for students' service. Botanical Garden has also been developed to provide practical exposure for teaching and learning. Our institution also has an English language lab carrying 20 computers wherein ORELL software has also been installed to improve the students' English language.

- **Classrooms:** The college encompasses 70 well-furnished, well-ventilated, spacious classrooms out of which 9 classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors for conducting theory classes.
- **Technology-Enabled learning facility:** The College has four ICT-enabled Classrooms where the provision of Multimedia learning, smart boards, Wi-Fi connectivity, and internet access is available.
- **Seminar Hall:** The College has multiple seminar halls. These halls are regularly used for conducting national/international seminars at the college. The students are promoted for active involvement in paper presentations, group discussions, etc.
- **Laboratories:** All laboratories are well equipped with state-of-the-art equipment and facilities. All the laboratories are established as per UGC norms. These labs are utilized for conducting practical classes as per the requirements of the curriculum. Labs are also utilized for technology learning & training as a part of teaching contents beyond the syllabus. Labs have sufficient licensed software and open source tools to cater to the requirements of curriculum & industry-enabled teaching.
- **Wi-Fi:** The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled with 24/7 internet facilities (available bandwidth 200 MBPS) for the students and staff. Internet facility is available in the whole campus including labs, classrooms, library, offices of all Departments and hostels.
- **Central Library:** The library has 35125 books available covering all major fields of Commerce, Science, and Humanity. The library also has separate study spaces available for boys and girls. Multiple Resources such as newsletters, journals, reference books are available for

students' self-learning at Central library.

The Institute, with its compulsory Core Courses and the continuous evaluation scheme, integrates sports and extra-curricular activities as essential components. This is done not only for participation but also for the assessment of students. The college has adequate facilities for sports, games and cultural activities. CRM Jat College has two large playgrounds and one auditorium with provisions for multiple games, such as Athletics, Cricket, Football, Hockey, Kabaddi, Volleyball, Basketball, and Kho-kho, etc. Indoor and outdoor badminton courts and gymnasium are also available. The college has well-equipped assembly halls for organizing annual functions and cultural events wherein various cultural events are being organized. Facilities for outdoor and indoor sports and games that include badminton, carrom, table tennis, chess, gymnasium, and cultural activities also exist in the Girls' Hostel. Intra-college and inter-college games and sports competitions are organized regularly every year for students. Students are especially being trained for participation in Zonal and Inter-Zonal National Youth Festivals, Poster making competitions, science exhibitions, etc. organized by the Indian varsities/colleges, Non-Profit Organisations. CRM Jat College has excelled at these events by winning prizes and awards in individual and group events. The athletic meet is also being organized in the Institute every year. The college participates in different events like Plays, Mimes, Folk Dance, One-Act Plays, Street Plays, etc. in the university inter-collegiate, State, and National levels. The annual function is also celebrated in the college each year to mark the birth anniversary of Seth Shri Chhaju Ram Ji. For this participation, students of the college are provided with experts' guidance in the college premises. 4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The college has developed IT facilities to meet the learning requirements of students and faculty. Some of the facilities are discussed below: -

Computer Lab: - The computer lab consists of 145 computers with Internet connectivity for the purpose of the students who opted for computer, mathematics, commerce, physics as part of their courses as well as for general purposes. All the required software as per the curriculum are installed and updated as and when required and the maintenance of the computers is done by the technicians as and when required.

English Language Lab:- One English Language Lab has been developed with 20 computers and the software required to train the students on revised grammar bits, phonetic pronunciation, phonetic transcription, and other English language skills. The college has also purchased ORELL software for this purpose.

Nine classrooms enabled with ICT facilities like a projector, a personal computer attached with a projector. One video recording room is also used for the online learning environment. Physics

lab, Botany Lab, Zoology Lab, and Computer Labs have projectors. The college has a well-equipped seminar hall enabled with ICT facilities like a projector, a personal computer attached with projector. In addition to projector and computer, seminar hall is equipped with mike, speakers and internet connection. The whole campus of the college has Wi-Fi facility with a speed of 10 Mbps. The computers and printers of the office and exam branch and Computer Labs are connected through LAN. The college website is monitored and updated from time to time by the Web Coordinator of the college. The computers of the college are connected with printers and scanners wherever required. The college has 2 multipurpose photocopy machines placed in the administrative block. There are 46 CCTV cameras installed in the entire campus area of the college to provide additional safety security to the students and the staff, for the prevention of untoward incidents on the campus. All the departments have computers, having Internet facility via Wi-Fi, and a leased line for smooth conduct of online classes. For maintenance (such as repairs/servicing of computers, Internet Wi-Fi networking, installation of software, and maintenance and up-gradation of hardware), all departments will approach the higher authorities and, repairs/servicing and up-gradation of computers are done accordingly. Software like Java, C, C++, SQL, and Tally is installed in computer labs. Institute has upgraded the 100 Mbps Internet connectivity to 200 Mbps. The Internet Service Provider (ISP) Reliance provides Jio Wi-Fi connectivity with 10Mbps Internet Connectivity and Triple play service has also been availed for the offices.

Laboratory: Laboratories are regularly maintained by the Laboratory attendant. Records of types of equipment are maintained in the stock Register as per the process. Equipment are maintained properly, calibrated, and serviced periodically. Major breakdown maintenance if required is carried out by external agencies.

- Working condition of computers, devices, and equipment is ensured.
- The working condition of machines in the laboratories is ensured.
- The cleanliness committee of the institute inspects the facilities like toilets, classrooms, corridors.
- The College administration supervises the cleanliness and hygiene in the canteen and monitors the food quality.
- The Library committee collects the specific needs of the students and staff.
- The sports committee ensures the availability of sports equipment and monitors the usage of the ground, courts, and indoor games facilities.

Examination and Evaluation

The academic calendar for conduct of examination and evaluation is prepared by GJUS&T. The college ensures that all examination related rules and regulations of the university are strictly followed. There is one midterm examination to be conducted in a semester by the institution and at the end of semester, end term examination and evaluation is conducted by the University. Under CBCS there is a mechanism of 80:20, in which evaluation for 80 marks is done through major examinations on semester basis and 20 marks are awarded on the basis of continuous evaluation through unit test, assignments, class attendance, class participation, etc.

Teaching and Learning

Teaching and learning has been organized through the academic calendar of the University. Student - centric learning is promoted through extensive use of ICT like smart class rooms, LCD projectors, etc. Seminars, conferences and extension lectures are organised to update the students' knowledge. List of Program/Course learning goals and outcomes are prepared by HOD which helps teachers to focus on the intended purpose of the curriculum and allow planning instructions to achieve the desired results in terms of knowledge, skills, and attitudes. Learning is promoted through various student-oriented activities like quiz competitions, declamation contests, and poster making

competitions etc. Remedial classes, internal tests are conducted on a routine basis.

Institute maintains & follows a well-planned process for the mobilization of funds and resources. The process involves various committees of the institute as well as Accounts office. Institute has designed some specific rules for the funds usage and utilization of resources.

- The student Tuition fee is the major source of funds inflow for the institute.
- The management provides need-based funds to the college.
- Various government and non-government agencies sponsor events like seminars and workshops.
- Retired faculty members donate items like water coolers, fans etc.
- Sponsorships are sought from individuals and corporate for cultural events and fests.

Utilization of Funds

- The purchase committee seeks quotations from vendors for the purchase equipment, computers, books, etc.

- The quotations are scrutinized by the purchase committee before a final decision is made based on parameters like pricing, quality, terms of service, etc.
- The Principal and purchase committee along with the accounts department ensure that the expenditure lies within the allotted budget. The intervention of the management is sought in case the expenditure exceeds the budget.

Resource Mobilization Policy and Procedure

- Just after the collection of students' fee, it is further segregated among various heads such as Amalgamation, R.K. Fund etc.. Availability of funds under each head is taken as the maximum amount to be spent (budget) for the respective purpose.
- The institutional budget includes recurring expenses such as salary, electricity and internet charges, stationery & other maintenance costs.
- It includes planned expenses such as lab equipment purchases, furniture, and other development expenses.
- The budget is scrutinized by the Accounts department and Purchase department monitor whether expenses are exceeding budget provision.
- Statutory auditors are also appointed who certify the financial statements in every financial year. The grants received by the college are also audited by certified auditors.

Optimal utilization of resources

- The college aims at promoting research, development, consultancy and such other activities, involving the faculty at various levels.
- The faculty, who exhibits initiative and receive substantial grants for R&D works or for strengthening the infrastructure in the institute would be encouraged and will receive special commendation.

- Effective utilization of infrastructure is ensured through the appointment of adequate and well-qualified lab technicians & system administrators.
- The optimal utilization is ensured through encouraging innovative teaching-learning practices.
- The available physical infrastructure is optimally utilized beyond regular college hours, to conduct remedial classes, co-curricular activities/extra-curricular activities, parent-teacher meetings.
- The college infrastructure is utilized as an examination centre for Government examinations/University Examinations.

7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year

To achieve the aim of women empowerment and promote gender equity, the college has adopted following measures:

1. **Women Cell:** A Women Cell, comprised of three female teachers, organizes counseling sessions, interactive talks and other such events to sensitize girl students towards their rights and roles in the society. It celebrates important days and events to strengthen the discourse of gender equality.
2. **Internal Complaint Committee/Anti-Sexual Harassment Committee:** The said committee is comprised of faculty members, representatives from NGO and legal consultant. It addresses the grievances of girl students and female employees and ensures gender based justice.
3. **Common Room Facility:** Separate Common Room Facility is available for girls.
4. **Girls Hostel:** The institution has a separate girls hostel with a capacity of 31 rooms.
5. **Safety and Security:** The institution has its own security service in the form of guards hired through an agency. Moreover, the Govt. of Haryana has initiated special security measures for girl students in the Higher Education Institutions by deputing "Durga Shakti" (female police personnels) in the colleges.

During the session 2020-21, the institution organized following activities to foster gender sensitivity:

1. An 'Online Intra-College Poetry Recitation Competition' was organized on September 05, 2020 by the Women Cell. Total 16 videos were received for the competition.
2. An Inter-college Thali Decoration Competition was organized by the Women Cell to celebrate 'Navratri Festival' in October 2020. Total 37 entries were received from different colleges for the competition.
3. A medical team associated with 'Anaemia Free Hisar Campaign' started under the supervision of District Administration, Hisar visited the college on Jan 16, 2021 for examining the HB-level of female students and staff members. Diet Charts and medicines were suggested to the students and staff members having low HB-level.
4. One Day Workshop on the topic 'Give Yourself a Makeover' was organized by the Women Cell on Feb 18, 2021.
5. Department of Geography organized a Public Exhibition on the theme 'From Veil to Wings: Status of Women in Haryana' on the occasion of International Women's Day on March 08, 2021.
6. Department of English organized an Extension Lecture on the topic 'Literature and Gender' on March 05, 2021. Prof. Sunita Siroha from Department of English, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra delivered this lecture.

The college has made efforts to manage the different kinds of waste at the institutional/source level. For solid waste management, Blue - Green dustbins sets worth capacity 480 ltrs have been installed at three main spots in the college for the purpose of waste segregation. The college has launched its Composting Section with two large compost pits sheltered with Compost Hut. Degradable waste is disposed to these pits in order to convert it in manure which is subsequently used in the college gardens/lawns. The launch of Composting Section was acknowledged by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Govt of India on its twitter handle, Swachh Sarvekshan 2021. Liquid Waste from the water coolers is collected in a large underground tank and used subsequently for watering the Circle Kabbadi Ground. As for E-waste, the college makes optimal use of dysfunctional computer equipments through repair, reuse or reassembling. The hardware which cannot be reused or recycled is disposed off. The institution however intends to sign MoU with relevant agencies for the management of E-waste in the coming years.

The Context:

The aim of education is to train students in such a manner that they take the learning beyond the walls of classroom and make selfless contribution to society. The institution is guided by a similar spirit advanced by the founder of the institution, Seth Chhaju Ram Chaudhary who brought immense change in society through his philanthropic deeds. The institution considers it one of its utmost responsibilities to promote the vision and ideology of its guiding force. Precisely to serve this objective, due attention is given to social outreach programmes and initiatives which are undertaken by the volunteers/cadets under the guidance of Programme Officer/Counsellor/NCC Officer.

The Practice:

3 NSS Units, NCC Army Wing (Boys), NCC Army Wing (Girls), NCC Air Wing, Youth Red Cross and Women Cell of the college are actively engaged in sensitizing students towards their social responsibilities. College NSS Units undertake various programmes in the adopted village Gangwa, urban slums and college campus. It conducted medical check-up camp as part of Anaemia Free Hisar Campaign of District Administration.

Best Practice-II

Title of the Practice: Financial Aid to the Deserving Students:

Many students seek admission from the rural areas with low economic background. Their parents are unable to provide them a sustained financial support because agriculture, being a source

of uncertain income, is the main source of livelihood to a majority of the people in Haryana.

Objectives of the Practice:

- To extend financial aid to the poor students, especially from the rural background, to save them from discontinuation of their studies owing to poverty.
- To support financially all the deserving poor students without any discrimination of caste, creed or gender.
- To promote the 'equality' among the students.
- Scholarships and Fee concession to Sports achievers, SC/ST students, students achieving academic excellence.

The Context:

Sending children to the city for higher education becomes almost impossible for the poor parents in the rural areas, in the context of higher education demanding higher amounts of money. Though, sometimes, they do venture to admit their children to colleges in the city, they are unable to give sustained financial support throughout the course of study because agriculture, being a source of uncertain income, is the main source of livelihood to a majority of the people in Haryana. So, it is evident that without financial support from an external source, the rural youth cannot hope to successfully complete their higher studies.

The Practice:

Fee Concession Committee is constituted. Committee asks aspirants to send parents tax return transcripts, sibling's college registration forms, proof of income or other supporting documentation etc. This illustrious institution, true to its legacy of pro poor student attitude since its inception, has taken a firm resolve to extend all possible financial support to the deserving students and help them to realize their fond dream of acquiring higher education. The financial support is extended to all the deserving poor students without any discrimination of caste, creed or gender. The students whose parents do not have fixed reasonable source of income are eligible for the aid. A duly constituted committee of senior teachers scrutinizes the

applications received from the aspirants for fee concession. It finalizes the list of eligible students for the Fee concession after due verification of the documentary evidence enclosed and strictly following the guidelines framed for the purpose, and submits the same to the Principal for sanctioning the actual amount of the aid.

Evidence of Success:

A good numbers of rural students have successfully completed their higher studies without facing financial hurdles due to the financial aid/concession given by the institution.

Problems Encountered and Resources Required:

- The noble objective had challenges in its designing and implementation.
- Pooling up of the required resources is a tough task.
- Verification of the financial background of the aspirants is yet another challenge.
