In her address, she traced the history of Indian cinema from the perspective of village and its representation. She catalogued an entire range of films that represented/misrepresented the idea of rurality and influenced public perception about the village. Our college is affiliated with Guru Jambheshwar University of Science & Technology, Hisar, so we follow the curriculum designed by the varsity only. At the beginning of the academic session, the college prepares the academic calendar which consists of curricular, co-curricular, and extracurricular activities for effective implementation and delivery of the curriculum. We undertake the following measures for effective delivery of the university curriculum at the college level

- There is a faculty-wise timetable committee that prepares the timetable as per workload for the academic session.
- A comprehensive teaching plan is prepared by every department and teacher which includes the delivery of lectures, tutorials, and practicals.
- The Principal addresses the newly admitted students in the "Induction/orientation Program". This program orients the students about facilities and welfare schemes available, code of conduct and discipline, add-on courses, and extra-curricular activities.
- The faculty members take a few lectures on the introduction of the curriculum. Unit Tests are conducted periodically and their results are displayed and discussed

Through this event, students are introduced to teaching-learning and evaluation programs, college discipline, various academic and other schemes along with development and achievements of the college, students' support services.

Teaching-learning methods adopted by the faculty members include Lecture Method, Interactive Method, Project-based Learning, Computer-assisted Learning, Experiential Learning, etc. The Teaching-learning activities are made effective through illustration and special lectures. To acquire first-hand knowledge on the subjects and current practices students are engaged in a field study. Lessons are taught through Powerpoint presentations to make learning interesting besides oral presenting methods.

- ICT-enabled teaching includes Wi-Fi-enabled classrooms with LCD, Language Lab, Smart Classrooms, etc.
- Virtual classroom links are also being provided to the students to maintain continuity in lectures during the lockdown.
- The institution adopts modern pedagogy in line with emerging trends to enhance the teaching-learning process.
- The institution has the essential equipment to support the faculty members and students.
- Regular practical sessions, Online grammar tests, Use of LCD projectors for seminars and workshops, Productive use of educational videos,
- Accounting software, online trading is offered by the Department of Commerce.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

There is a standard process of internal assessment in the college. According to the academic calendar, a student has to appear in a 1-unit test and submit 2 assignments. The schedule of the internal examination is decided by the examination committee. Faculty members are obliged to take the unit tests according to the date sheet prepared by the examination committee. The test copy of the unit test is shown to students for their observation and the students' performance is discussed in the classrooms. Records of unit tests and assignments are maintained by the faculty members. For transparent and robust internal assessment, the following mechanisms are conducted • Internal Examination Committee. • Conduct of Examination • Result display • Interaction with students regarding their internal assessment. The method of internal assessment helps the teachers to evaluate the students more appropriately. Due to internal assessment, the interest of the student towards learning has also been increasing.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

At the college level, an examination committee is constituted by the principal for the smooth conduction of internal examination (unit test). The end-semester examination is conducted by the university, and the students appear at the examination centers allotted by the university. The college strictly follows the guidelines and rules issued by the affiliating university while conducting internals and

end-semester examinations. For conducting the internal assessment test, a department level coordinator/committee is constituted • One internal unit test is conducted each semester. • Time table for the internal examination is prepared well in advance and communicated to the students. • After evaluation of answer books, the same are shown to the students to check any discrepancy or doubt in checking. If they come across any doubts, clarification is given by the faculty members. • By adopting the criteria as per the direction of affiliating university, complete transparency is maintained in internal assessment tests. • Just after the preparation of the tentative internal assessment, one of the copies of the same is shared among students. Students are also given ample time to submit their objections regarding assessment. • The final internal assessment marks (calculated on the basis of attendance, class test, and assignments) are uploaded on the university portal at the end of each semester.

At the Departmental level, the Heads of the Department and the teachers who are engaged in any class strive to complete the courses in time and in some cases, extra classes are conducted for the students who they identify as relatively average. The 75 per cent of compulsory attendance to qualify for writing the examination of the courses is adhered to, to ensure students participate in the class. The attendance is also tied with marks. Faculty members are also obliged to maintain the complete data of the students so that the teacher can keep apprising the student about their progress. The continuous evaluation is done through tests, written assignments, project work, oral presentations, ?eldwork and so on. The end semester examination of every course is based on a written examination of three hours, the question paper of which is required to test the knowledge of the student from every unit prescribed for study. Programme speci?c outcomes are measured by taking the aggregate result of all courses in a given programme of an individual student, and then the average performance of all the students in a given programme.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution's campus spans 22 acres, 1 Kanal, and 7 marlas, on which 16187.4 square meters of structures have been built. A spacious garden with pavements and pavers on the campus is developed for college students. Botanical Garden has also been developed to provide hands-on experience for teaching and learning. The institution has created an environment that tries to provide plenty

of extracurricular and support services run by the NCC and NSS. There are distinct blocks housing the various departments for the streams of arts, commerce, and science.

- **Classrooms:-** There are 70 spacious, well-furnished classrooms at the college, nine of which have LCD projectors and four classrooms are ICT-enabled.
- **Seminar Rooms:** There are numerous seminar rooms at the College. The college frequently uses these halls for international and national seminars.
- **Laboratories:** College labs are set up in accordance with UGC guidelines and practical classes are held in these labs in accordance with the curriculum's requirements.
- **Library:** The library has 35638 books on all major subjects in business, science, and humanities. Boys and girls have separate study areas in the library. Students can self-learn with a variety of resources like newsletters, journals, and reference books.

- **Staff Station:** - It is used to retrieve book information from the koha software. such as ISSN No., Subject, and so on.
- **I-Card Reader:** - Each student's identity card contains a unique QR code, which is scanned by the I-card reader to obtain information about the book borrower (student).
- **Kiosk:** - A Kiosk has also been installed in the library, which is utilized by students to issue and return books on their own.
- **RFID Gate:** - This gate is installed at the library's entrance to prevent unauthorized access to the books.
- **Handle Reader:** - This device counts the books stored in the almirahs. In addition, the position of the book can be determined with this equipment.

The college has launched its Composting Section with two large compost pits sheltered with Compost Hut. Degradable waste is disposed to these pits in order to convert it in manure which is subsequently used in the college gardens/lawns. Liquid Waste from the water coolers is collected in a large underground tank and used subsequently for watering the Circle Kabbadi Ground. College has also

established a Rain/Water Water Harvesting & Recharge Unit during the session. As for Dry & E-waste management, the college has signed two MoUs with Green Dream Foundation, New Delhi. As per MoUs, waste generated from the campus would be sent for recycling to the Central Pollution Control Board Authorized recycler. 4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The institution's campus spans 22 acres, 1 Kanal, and 7 marlas, on which 16187.4 square meters of structures have been built. A spacious garden with pavements and pavers on the campus is developed for college students. Botanical Garden has also been developed to provide hands-on experience for teaching and learning. The institution has created an environment that tries to provide plenty of extracurricular and support services run by the NCC and NSS. There are distinct blocks housing the various departments for the streams of arts, commerce, and science.

- **Classrooms:-** There are 70 spacious, well-furnished classrooms at the college, nine of which have LCD

- **Library:** The library has 35638 books on all major subjects in business, science, and humanities. Boys and girls have separate study areas in the library. Students can self-learn with a variety of resources like newsletters, journals, and reference books.

- **Staff Station:** - It is used to retrieve book information from the koha software. such as ISSN No., Subject, and so on.
- **I-Card Reader:** - Each student's identity card contains a unique QR code, which is scanned by the I-card reader to obtain information about the book borrower (student).
- **Kiosk:** - A Kiosk has also been installed in the library, which is utilized by students to issue and return books on their own.
- **RFID Gate:** - This gate is installed at the library's entrance to prevent unauthorized access to the books.
- **Handle Reader:** - This device counts the books stored in the almirahs. In addition, the position of the book can be determined with this equipment.

For solid waste management, Blue - Green dustbins sets worth capacity 480 ltrs have been installed at three main spots in the college for the purpose of waste segregation. The college has launched its Composting Section with two large compost pits sheltered with Compost Hut. Degradable waste is disposed to these pits in order to convert it in manure which is subsequently used in the college gardens/lawns. Liquid Waste from the water coolers is collected in a large underground tank and used subsequently for watering the

Circle Kabbadi Ground.College has also established a Rain/Water Water Harvesting & Recharge Unit during the session. As for Dry & E-waste management, the college has signed two MoUs with Green Dream Foundation, New Delhi. As per MoUs, waste generated from the campus would be sent for recycling to the Central Pollution Control Board Authorized recycler. Moreover, the institution makes optimal use of dysfunctional computer equipments through repair, reuse or reassembling.
